- I. Meeting called to order by Commissioner Dhir at 7:01.
- II. Roll call completed.

- IV. Approval of Minutes from 7.19.2023. Commissioner Dhir motioned to approve the 7.19.2023 meeting minutes and was seconded by Commissioner Blinder. Motion carried with all in favor.
- V. Old Business
  - A. Policy Priorities
    - 1. PrEP access:
      - a) Schedule H&W Meeting with Senator Lam
      - b) Consider for policy priority
      - c) Reach out to those opposed and address past concerns
      - d) SB64 Provider vs. pharmacist concerns and complexity
        - (1) Doesn't necessarily increase access
      - e) Preventative care should be covered at 100%
      - f) Advocacy lead on this?
      - g) Identify folks around the state
      - h) Model bill? California has good policies
      - i) Commissioner Dhir will create draft of what the ideal PrEP access policy will look like
    - 2. Access to mental health
      - Not enough providers with training and knowledge to care for LGBTQIA+ patients
      - b) Some medical providers don't take insurance because the reimbursements are so low
      - c) Less about access and more about expanding increasing a knowledgeable and culturally competent workforce
      - d) Even more limited providers for transgender patients

- e) Access piece is around Medicaid if you are not near Chase Brexton or Whitman Walker you are not going to get good healthcare

- g) Legacy issues around Medicaid and challenges to sign up to take Medicaid prevent providers from

  - a) Important that we talk about it

- B. Recommendations and best practices for 2023 Annual Report. Commissioner Fox made a motion for the Health & Wellness Committee to prepare recommendations and best practices list below and was seconded by Commissioner Blinder. Motion carried with all in favor.
  - 1. PrEP access one page draft what ideal access would look like
  - 2. Address lack of providers and access to affirming mental health care services through
    - a) Increased training and education for providers
    - b) Funding for providers providing gender affirming care medical and mental health care statewide proficiency certification?
    - c) Requirement for LGBTQIA+ training for license renewals
    - d) CEU providers for LGBTQIA+ care providers inclusive of gender affirming care and particularly surgical care
    - e) Training should be offered by people with lived experience
  - 3. Address quality of care for people of color in healthcare causing disparities in LGBTQIA+ and gender affirming care
    - a) Anti-Blackness in gender affirming care
    - b) Language barriers
  - 4. Address Trans Health Equity Act implementation barriers:
    - a) Electrolysis providers don't take insurance in Maryland/NPI(National Provider Identifier)
    - b) Patients must cash pay
    - c) Not reimbursed
