I. Call to Order:

II. Opening Remarks:

- ❖ Ernesto Chanona gave welcoming remarks and went over meeting procedures.
- ❖ Lawrence Walker, Executive Director of the Governor's Office of Community Initiatives. Director Walker asked that the commission choose 2 of the 10 Governor priorities to focus on and set up a structure for those two priorities and then setup a goal for what the commission wants to accomplish in 2024. He announced that Dr. Aitza Haddad Nunez resigned as a commissioner and is now an employee of GOCI as our new Administrator Director for the Hispanic and Caribbean commissions. COS Yancey reminded the commission of our focus on issues (concerns, potential legislation, etc.), events (opportunities to celebrate culture/history), and infrastructure (what we can build and have in place for future administrations and future generations).

IV. Cheryl Madigan provided brief remarks concerning her position with GOCI. She is the Ethnic Project Coordinator for all seven commissions and Fiscal Administrator for GOCI.

VI. Executive Order Discussion

COS Yancey went over the executive orders. There are three branches of government, which are the Executive branch – which enforces the laws, the Legislative branch – which creates which makes the laws and the Judicial branch – which interprets the laws. The Commission will provide feedback to the Governor to make decisions. There are bylaws under the executive order, which cannot contradict the executive order. The executive orders were created in 2007 and GOCI is working on updating the order and bylaws. The supposed changes will be given to the commission for review before submitting to the Governor.

VII. Bylaw Discussion

COS Yancey provided some brief description of what it consists of. Commissioners need to review the material from their binders.

IX. Commission Support, Procurement and Affirmation of Sub-Committees

Ethnic Project Coordinator Madigan explained sponsorship and in-kind donations. COS Yancey went into more detail about events (Governor representation, non-profits and other state agencies for partnership, citations, venues, talent, etc.) We go through our own communication department for approval of anything made public. If a commissioner would like to have something posted to our website or they have an opportunity to be interviewed, they should reach out to GOCI for approval. The annual report will be composed by GOCI's Administrative Director with input from the commission. The Vice Chair and Secretary will be voted on at the first regular meeting of the commission. Each subcommittee will come up with topics for discussion and set goals. GOCI will provide the commission notice of any legislation bills that would be coming up that would affect the Hispanic communities and if they would want to address it or address it as a private citizen. Commissioners should inquire before addressing.

X. Governor's Commission on Hispanic Affairs 2024 Agenda Discussion

This discussion will be tabled until the next meeting, which will be part two of the SPS. Each Commissioner gave a brief introduction of themselves.
